# Broadfield Farm Trip Monday 4th June

As parking is tight it may be helpful if some parents wished to car share, but we will let you arrange that amongst yourselves.

## **Our Learning Term 4**

The children are all settling wonderfully into their new nursery. So far we have had a very smooth transition. The children are becoming familiar with the room layout and the nursery team have been able to identify how the children are using the space. Details of the children's learning outcomes will be set on our new planning wall in the Nursery Foyer.

As you may be aware, our outdoor space has not been developed yet, at the moment our outdoor play area consists of NO soft surfaces, with lots of space to run, this is a big hit with the children however not so good on their elbows and knees. The children are being encouraged to take care when running, making them aware that sprinting may not be the safest option and to practice jogging instead. Sprint running is much more appealing to them! If you are concerned about this it might be best to wear lightweight trousers/leggings to minimise skint knees.

This term we will be looking at growth, in terms of planting, flowers and looking after living things. This week the children have been creating their own still life pictures, getting used to our new routine and lots of outdoor play.

In role play the children have loved having their own café, using real cups, kindly donated by the Olive Tree Deli in Biggar. Their interests are now moving on and we are hoping to set up our own opticians where the children will have the opportunity to develop their numeracy and literacy skills through social interaction with their peers. If anyone has any old glasses/sunglasses adult or children's donations would be very welcome.

Prior to moving into our new build we began piloting together time with the children at the end of the day. We felt that having Together at the end of the day allowed the children uninterrupted play. Together Time has a more structured focus with the adults leading the learning. At Together Time the adult will plan learning experiences to meet the needs and interests of the group, children can reflect on their learning, listen to stories in a smaller group giving them the opportunity to share ideas and ask questions, along with lots of other learning experiences.
