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Head Teacher's Report

I hope all our families had a lovely half term. We are now into the final five weeks of the Spring term and, as usual, lots has been happening this month and we have events planned for March.

New build: Work has now begun in earnest on our new building. Trenches have been dug, fences put up and large piles of earth have arrived! There are vehicles in and out of the site on a daily basis. I will be meeting with the build team at the beginning of March and will update parents regarding progress in the next newsletter. The original date of December 2017 for building to be completed remains the same. We do not have a definite date for moving into the new buidling as yet.

In-service: Nursery, support and primary staff participated in a training session on attachment and autism. This was led by our Educational Psychologist, Kirsten Allen, and was a very informative session. Nursery staff also completed some self evaluation work whilst primary staff discussed the Working Time Agreement and looked at the new way reading books are now organised (known as book banding) led by Mrs Kilgallon.

Staff development: Tinto teachers have also been working with the teachers at Biggar Primary School over four evening sessions. The teachers have been working in groups and discussing the standardised maths scores for each stage. This has allowed the teachers to have a professional dialogue around teaching strategies, assessments and resources. Staff have also updated the maths programme as a result and are hoping to have observation visits in our respective schools.

Students: Mrs Mairi Maxfield has been teaching in P6/7 since the end of January and will complete her placement on the 3rd of March. Mrs Maxfield will return to teach in P2/3 from the 17.4.17-19.5.17. We also welcomed Andrew Shanks to the nursery class this week. Mr Shanks has four day visits to the nursery over the next three weeks and then returns in May for a three week placement. We do benefit from teaching students as they bring in new ideas regarding resources and teaching approaches. Hopefully they too benefit from working with our experienced teachers.

Assemblies: Rev Shand has been in school to take assemblies this month. His P4-7 assembly about Jewish festivals supported by photos of his time living in Jerusalem was very interesting.

The Pupil Committees and JRSO's have also presented powerpoints at the assemblies this month. The children excel at this and are always highly organised and proficient. Well done to everyone involved.

Lunch time clubs: We have been very fortunate this month as we have had two lunch time clubs organised by Active Breaks and paid for by the After School Club. The children have had the opportunity to participate in tennis and fitness sessions.

We also have pupil led clubs at the moment – currently these include dodgeball and dancing. The children organise and lead these activities and do so very well indeed.

Nursery: The nursery class has had a series of open mornings this week and staff and parents were able to discuss how the children experience the Curriculum for Excellence in a nursery setting. Parents also had the opportunity to look around the nursery displays.

School openings: Two of the Biggar Learning Community schools have their official opening next week. Carnwath P.S on the 27th February and Biggar Primary on the 1st March. Pupils are involved in these events and celebrate their school with songs and drama. Hopefully it won't be long until we are planning ours!

- Literacy week an email has been sent to all families detailing the events that will be taking place. Thanks to Mrs Kilgallon for co-ordinating the activities. I am sure the children will enjoy the week
- **Developing the Young Workforce**: This is a Learning Community event for all P6 pupils. It takes place on the <u>3.3.17</u> in Biggar Municipal Hall. The pupils will be working in teams to develop skills needed in the workplace – such as communication, time management, group work etc. It will be great fun and an opportunity to meet pupils from the other primaries that may be in their classes at Biggar High
