#### World Book Day 1st March

On Thursday 1st March, we will be celebrating World Book within the nursery. We would love to see the children dressed up as their favourite book character pj's or fancy dress, the choice is yours! We would welcome the children to bring in a copy of their favourite book, to look at together at welcome time.

# Our Learning Term 1 The Young Child's room (3-5)

This term as part of our focused learning we have developing our numeracy skills through talking and thinking about journeys. To support the children's learning we have been looking at Julia Donaldson's story 'What the Ladybird Heard'. The children have loved using the beebots (small robots) to input simple directions, helping the beebots move around the farm map they created, introducing them to the different characters within the story. This term we have been focusing on retelling stories through role play, the children have particularly liked retelling the story of Mr Wolf's pancakes. In free play the children have been creating their stories and creating their own roles within their imaginative play, we are currently responding to the children's interest in superheroes.

Within the playroom Miss Johnstone has been working with the children in block play. The children have made some wonderful structures, working on their own and playing cooperatively. Through block play they have had the opportunity to develop their understanding of science, learning about simple types of forces using cars and balls with the large planks, investigating how far they can travel. The children have been exploring symmetry and balancing when using the blocks. Miss Johnstone has been talking to the children about the different types of blocks, using the correct names and the mathematical relationship between the different blocks.

Over the next few weeks we will be planning walks around Symington, including a visit to our local shop. Our community walks will enhance the children's learning giving them the opportunity to participate and track their own journey and use real money in purchasing items within the shop.

We have reintroduced the den within the nursery responding to the children. The children have been developing their ideas in their own role play through making masks and crowns.

In literacy the children have been discovering environmental print e.g. recognising familiar signs and logos, developing their pre reading skills., you can continue to support and develop this while out and about with your shill and at home too.
