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Head Teacher's Report

Happy New Year to all Tinto families. I hope that everyone had a lovely time with family and friends over the festive season. The new year and school term has started well and we are all raring to go!

There was not a December newsletter so below is a summary of events that took place in December followed by news / information for January and this term.

Erratum: Apologies to the P7 Rotary Quiz team – I inadvertently typed in the House Captains names instead of the team. The hard working team were: Molly & Sam Mitchell, Murray Taylor and Ellie Garrett. They were fantastic representatives of Tinto P.S. Well done!

Nativities: The Nursery and P1-3 Nativities were a joy to behold! As usual the children and staff worked very hard in the run up with rehearsals and learning the songs. There were the usual unplanned incidents (angels arguing; Kings forgetting their gifts much to Mary's annoyance) that make these events memorable. Thank you for your support in buying raffle tickets and contributing to the teas, coffee and mince pies.

Time Capsule: The time capsule was buried on the 21st December, Winter Solstice, near the sundial. Each class discussed what they wished to place in the capsule that represented their views of Tinto P.S & N.C. There were pictures, films, written pieces and a pencil! I.P update: We are continuing to update the Behaviour policy, a draft has been discussed at the Parents council and this will be discussed with the Pupil Council this term. A staff working party are compiling resources to support the pupils in evaluating their own writing in line with Curriculum for Excellence and setting their own learning targets Staff are continuing to refine the "Support for Learning" leaflets that are issued to some parents following the completion of termly plans and meetings with class teachers and H.T.

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All staff will be attending "Number Talks" training this term to enhance mental maths provision. Staff will also be working with Linda Keith, internationally renowned maths expert, in their own classrooms this February.

Staff will complete their "Talk for Writing" training this term and will be implementing the resource in class.

The playground buddies (Fergus & Poppy) are now operating in the playground to support their peers if they have no one to play with / have a "falling out" with a friend.
