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### Head Teacher's Report

This is the final newsletter of the Spring Term. There have been many opportunities for the pupils to achieve success and celebrate their learning. The pupils have enjoyed showing their parents / carers their work and progress during open afternoons, parent workshops and Parents Evening. The P4-7 concert was a resounding success and showcased the pupil's talents. There have also been sporting opportunities for the pupils. Details of exactly what we have all been up to are detailed below.

**P4-7 "Let The Games Begin":** The two public performances were a great success and were a fitting tribute to the extremely hard work that the children and staff had put into this show. The singing, dancing and acting were absolutely tremendous and every pupil had the opportunity to shine. The feedback from families was full of praise.

Carole McKenzie, Head of Education, visited the school and had the opportunity to hear two if the songs and watch one of the dance pieces. She declared it "outstanding". Well done to everyone involved.





**Staffing:** Mrs MacConnell began her maternity leave on 25<sup>th</sup> of March. We wish her and her husband the very best as they begin their parenting journey. We look forward to hearing about the new addition to the family. Mrs Bowden will take P1 until the end of the school year. Mrs Rodger will return from maternity leave at the start of the Summer Term and will take on the remit from Mrs Bowden of nursery and CCC.

We will also be welcoming Mrs Shillan to the nursery as an Early Years Worker. Mrs Shillan will be taking over from Mrs McPhail on a Friday. We look forward to welcoming Mrs Shillan to Tinto N.C.

**ParentApp:** There has been some feedback concerning the number of messages that are sent out from school to the app. Please remember that you can turn off notifications from other classes so that you only receive messages from the office and your child's class. As each message has a word limit, it is often the case that we have to issue more than one message a day.

**Open Afternoon:** It was lovely to see so many families coming along to the Open Afternoon. This is an opportunity for the children to discuss their pupil portfolios with parents/ carers and to show their families around the school.

**Numeracy workshop:** There was a good turnout for the numeracy workshop and feedback was very positive. This is an opportunity for parents, working with their children, to learn about the strategies that are used in class to support learning. These strategies can then be used at home to support homework activities. It also allows parents to see how teaching and learning is continually evolving. Next session we will be offering "open classroom" events where parents can join their child during a lesson.



**Cross Country:** P4-7 pupils have been participating in cross country training as part of their P.E lessons this term. This was supported by coaches from Active Schools. P6-7 pupils went onto take part in the Clydesdale cross country event in Lanark. Well done to everyone – it was a very cold, windy and wet day. Congratulations to Eva Tweedie and Molly Mitchell for their success in making it through to the South Lanarkshire finals.

**Literacy week / recipe book:** The pupils and staff had a fun filled Literacy week co-ordinated by Mrs Kilgallon. Every class took part in baking and will be producing a recipe book so that they can continue to bake at home. The children also took part in a "River of Reading", listened to each class teacher read from their favourite book and read their own book throughout the week. Staff and pupils also dressed up on World Book Day, either as a character from a book or in their pj's – and everyone had a snuggle with their blankets and soft toys in the hall for a bedtime story!

P7 hamper / fund raising/ bingo night/dress down: This has been a busy month for fund raising - thank you so much for supporting these events. The P7 pupils have almost raised enough money for their P7 night out. Funds raised from the lucky programme (P4-7 show) and dress down days go into school fund and pay for the "extras" such as ingredients for baking, certificates, stickers, top table awards etc.

The Bingo night was a great success and raised £363! Thank you very much for supporting this event. We are planning to buy additional chrome books so we have enough for one between 2 in a class.

Amazing pupil: Tommy Ronaldson (P4) has been growing his hair since P2 and it is now down his back. He has decided to have his hair cut and sent to The Princess Trust to be made into a wig for a child who has lost their hair due to cancer treatment. This will take place on April 27<sup>th</sup>. Tommy has a jar in school for sponsor money and also has a Just Giving page if you want to sponsor him. He also has a short film on youtube explaining what he is doing and why. We are very proud of Tommy as he is showing that he is an "Effective Contributor"!

**ASC:** The ASC committee have worked hard this term organising activities for the children. They have ensured a balance of sports and crafts for this term and next. Sea Life: The P2/3 class have been learning about our oceans, what lives in them and how we can work together to keep them free of pollution. To bring their learning together the children spent a day at Deep Sea World where they participated in a workshop and saw marine life up close. Thanks to Miss Kennedy for organising the event, to Mrs Gilbert for organising the paperwork and to Mrs Mackay-Tervitt and Mr Kay for accompanying the children.

The class followed this up with a fantastic class assembly on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March. They demonstrated that they have learned amazing facts about the sea and some very sobering ones about the effect of human pollution on our oceans.

Holi: Holi is a Hindu Festival celebrating Spring. The nursery children and staff have been learning about the festival and took part in an activity that involved throwing coloured powder at each other. They had great fun and went home in all colours of the rainbow! The P4-7 children participated in a slightly cleaner version and drew around a friend and then sprayed paint around their figure.

**P7 Transition**: Mr Stewart, H.T at Biggar High, spent an afternoon with P7 this month. Mr Stewart worked with the children on a piece of reading and spoke about Biggar High School and the experiences they would have there. The children enjoyed listening and having the opportunity to ask questions.

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**Nursery-P1 transition:** The P6 pupils have been spending time in the nursery class this term, getting to know the children who will be coming to P1. The P6 pupils have also been told who their p1 buddies will be – to great excitement! They will introduce themselves next term and will be taking their buddy out to play at designated playtimes.

**Parent Council:** The Parent Council met this month and engaged in an evaluation activity focussing on family learning. The evaluations highlighted good practice in terms of family engagement and next steps identified included an open class event and filming teaching activities so parents can watch with their children and support homework. Staff and pupils will also evaluate their experiences of family learning. These combined evaluations will inform part of next session's Improvement Plan.

The other items on the agenda included a staffing update and a discussion about applying for grants to enhance the school grounds, ICT and the expressive arts curriculum.

**Parents Evening**: There was a very good turn out for Parents Evening. Parents received a brief summary of their child's progress since October and next steps. This information should not have been new as parents have been continually updated throughout the year through the termly information leaflets, How We Are Supporting Your Child updates, pupil portfolios and open days. The Parent Evening does give time to ask for clarification and how to support children's learning at home.

**Easter Eggs / Bonnets:** As mentioned in the February newsletter, the theme for the Easter Eggs this year is "Europe". The theme for the bonnets is "Spring / Easter". All entries are to be handed in on the first day of the summer term, clearly named. Part of the judge's criteria is that the entries are clearly made by children – a little adult help is ok! Winners will be announced at the Easter Service on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> April. We look forward to seeing the entries.
