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Head Teacher's Report

As the song says – that's another year over.....and we're already preparing for the new one! Tinto pupils and staff have had a very enjoyable year, full of achievements and proud moments. Hopefully our parents and the local community also agree that 2011-12 has been a super school year. Events in June were:

P1-7 Sports Day: This was a great success and pupils, parents and staff all enjoyed the fact that the event consisted of races and field events. It was a more traditional sports day than in the past and hopefully inspired some budding Olympians! Thank you very much to all those who were able to come along and support the event. It was lovely to see such a good turnout.

Nursery sports: Even though we had to host the event in the decant hall due to the weather, it was another resounding success. The children participated in lots of races, cheering on their friends and then their parents in the parent race! Some of the P6 buddies were on hand to help and give out stickers.

P5: TheP5 pupils enjoyed a half day sports event at Carluke Sports Centre. The event was very well organised and the children completed a number of activities during their session. They thoroughly enjoyed the event. Thanks to Mrs Harvie for accompanying the class.

P5-7 trip: The two classes had an interesting day at the People's Palace, learning about Glasgow in the 50's and 60's. P7 transition: The P7 pupils had workshops this month with the P7 pupils from Coulter and Lamington. Mr Stewart (H.T. at Biggar High) completed some literacy work with the children during one workshop and a member of staff from the art department spent two mornings with the pupils designing portraits for a high school mural. Their work will be on display when they go up to Biggar High in August.

P1: The P1 class had an open afternoon where parents were greatly entertained by various puppet shows (hand made puppets and original scripts!) and looked at all the exciting work generated by the dragon's visit. Their topic was nicely rounded off with a trip to the Puppet Theatre. Once again, Tinto Fund Raisers contributed towards the cost of the transport.

Leavers Assemblies: The nursery and P7 pupils hosted their Leavers Assemblies on Wednesday 27th June. The nursery children celebrated their last day as nursery pupils with a magician and were presented with a certificate and presents by the nursery staff. The children (and parents) thoroughly

enjoyed the show. We look forward to seeing the children in P1 in August and wish those going to other schools all the best.

The P7 pupils hosted an Oscar style Leavers Assembly. Pupils were nominated and presented with various awards during the afternoon.
